#### **Volunteers Needed to Help with Reading in School**

If you or any aunts, uncles or grandparents have some spare time during the week and would like to come in and listen to children practise their reading (all year groups), we would love to hear from you.

Just one hour per week would be extremely helpful and volunteers get enormous pleasure from seeing the difference that a few hours of their time can make to a child's reading ability, confidence and enjoyment.

Please contact the school office if you would like further details and, if you require a DBS certificate, we can get everything sent out and set up to allow you volunteer within the school.

### **Earrings in PE**

Just a reminder that for Health and Safety reasons if your child wears earrings they will need to be removed for PE lessons.

If your child is able to remove their own earrings then please provide them with a small container so that the earrings can be removed and stored safely prior to the PE lesson.

If your child is unable to take out their earrings by themselves, then they will need to be removed before coming to school on any day your child has a PE lesson.

If a child's earrings cannot be removed, then they will not be able to undertake PE as plasters to cover them are not considered a sufficiently safe alternative. Therefore, to avoid this occurring, we would recommend that if your child is having their ears pierced, then this is done on the first day of the Summer Holidays to allow sufficient time for them to heal and allow removal.

#### **Parking in Staff Car Park**

Please can we remind all parents and carers that unless there has been prior agreement, please do not park in the staff car park, even if your child is late. This is for safety reasons and to make sure the car park remains accessible at all times.

#### **Packed Lunches**

Please can all parents ensure that if their child brings in a packed lunch that this is brought in with them at the start of the day. We have noticed an increase in parents dropping off packed lunches at other times which is not only time consuming but disruptive to lessons.

#### Attendance - Holidays in Term Time

I am writing to remind you that absence from school can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances and family holidays are not considered by Surrey County Council to be an exceptional circumstance.



If you wish to take your child out of school for exceptional reasons you will need to notify the school using our 'Leave of Absence in Exceptional Circumstances' form at least two weeks before the absence and you will be informed as to whether the absence can be authorised.

The national expectation is that children attend 100% of sessions the school is open.

Unauthorised absences of 5 days or more will result in a penalty notice and fine being issued by Surrey County Council. Penalty notices and fines will also be issued to parents whose child's attendance generally falls below 90%
